# **Principal's Message**

Dear parents and carers,

Our school's Wakakirri team has been invited to perform at the ACT Awards Showcase Night next Monday – a showcase of all the best performances over the course of all performance nights. This is a huge honour, and a big commitment once again from our staff and our year 4 students who have had to decide between a full camp experience or part camp/part Wakakirri. Thank you to those of you who will attend, cheer Majura on, beam with pride and collect your tired children at the end of the show. What a team!

Week 6 is full of camp next week. The year 4s are off to Birrigai from Monday to Wednesday, and the year 5s are going to Kianinny at Tathra. School is going to feel quiet without them, but I wish them a wonderful time full of new experiences. Your homes might feel a bit quiet too!

While I'm talking about camps, please remember that if your finances are tight at the time that the school is requesting excursion/camp/book pack etc money, we can help you. All you have to do is email or phone me, and the school will take care of the finance side, providing you complete all permission notes by the due date. I know it can be embarrassing to ask for help, but I don't ask any questions of you or make any judgements – I've had finance pressures over the years myself, and we don't want your kids to miss out on any school experiences because of money concerns.

Yesterday we started djembe drumming with some year 3-6 students. We have purchased a set of djembes and employed Mohamed, an African Drum Master from Sydney, and a local musician Oake, who has worked with Mohamed before, to work with the students once a week for

the rest of this term. 60 students arranged in three multi-aged groups were selected by their teachers to trial the program this term, and this is something we're planning on developing over the next few years. Kristy, Doris, Sharee and I will be learning alongside the students and there are a group of staff who have enrolled in a Saturday workshop next month to try to keep up with the kids!

- An email about the parent survey, including a unique link to access the survey. Genuine survey invitation emails will have the title "The 2024 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey is now open!" and will be sent from EDU Surveys & Evaluation with 'from' address <a href="mailto:EDUSurveys@act.gov.au">EDUSurveys@act.gov.au</a>.

If you do not receive the survey invitation, please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, please contact the Majura Primary School front office on 6142 3140.

The Parents and Carers Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys will be available at the front office.

For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. Your feedback is important, and we hope you will take part.


The theme for this year's Book Week is "Reading is Magic." Some magical things have been happening in Year Three this week!

# KITCHEN GARDEN NEWS





# It's seed sowing time!

Year 4 students have been diving into their lessons on garden pest insects, conducting an insect audit in the garden. With the overnight temperatures rising and some warmer days, we're starting to see more insects hatching. So far, we've discovered green peach aphids on the kale, harlequin bugs on the silverbeet, and a cabbage white butterfly in the veggie patch.

Meanwhile, Year 3 and Year 5 students have been working on their class composts. This fortnight has been their last chance to feed the compost, adjust the moisture balance, and check for any decomposing critters. The composts are beginning to generate heat as they break down, with slaters and worms moving in to do their crucial work. Some of the classes have also had some 'clay play' – a chance to use their imagination to make and play with clay soil – messy but so much fun!

Our dedicated Thursday morning garden volunteers—Nicola, Sarah B., Sarah K., Jess, and Joan—have sown the first summer vegetable seeds: capsicum, chilli, and eggplant. The seeds are placed on heat mats to maintain a soil temperature of 30 degrees for optimal germination. Students have also started sowing flower seeds, including zinnia and cosmos.

As the garden comes to life and the warmth of spring approaches, we can't wait to see the fruits of our labor and the colourful blooms that will soon fill our garden beds.


# **World Environment Day Winners**



Majura has introduced a purple-lidded bin to help broaden our recycling initiatives. Students will find the bin in the school courtyard alongside the canteen to maximise the drink containers which are purchased by students through the canteen. We are exploring the possibility of introducing a



smaller purple bin into each class as another collection point.



10 cent recycling means for every container correctly placed in the bins, the school earns 10 cents which can be redirected back into our school programs.

### CAMPBELL HIGH SCHOOL BAND PROGRAM

Dear Potential Campbell High School Parents and Carers,

We are currently exploring how we can provide our students with opportunities to engage in the Band program while also allowing our Band students to fully participate in our electives program, particularly in the Arts and Tech area.

Current planning is leaning towards a model where students would miss one lesson from each of their other classes during a two-week teaching cycle. This adjustment will not result in any academic penalties for the students, and students will be given consideration and support for any lessons missed. Students would be assessed in addition to their electives, though we would ensure the workload remains manageable. We believe this approach will also help us grow and strengthen our program.

We are committed to ensuring students' academic progress remains on track while they pursue their musical interests and talents. Another option could be moving Band lessons to before or after regular school hours, e.g., 8 am-9 am or 3 pm-4 pm, though this could impact students' extracurricular activities and family time.

We understand this potential change may raise questions or concerns and value your input. We have attached a <u>survey</u> for you to provide feedback, though I am happy to chat via email or phone if you would prefer.
