Principal's Message

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome to semester 2 of our year of learning. I hope your children had a good break from school and are starting the term refreshed. I know many of you managed to wangle some time off too which must have been great. I loved chatting to the kids on Tuesday morning, hearing about their holidays and seeing their excited faces to be back at school.

Term 3 is a big term both from an academic and an activities perspective. Being an AFL fan, I have shared with staff the notion that term 3 (like the 3rd quarter of a game of footy) is the term where we can make big wins (the premiership quarter). I know that we may experience some interruptions to this – people get sick or are injured and family concerns override the focus on work, but it is certainly our intention to aim high and get 'stuck in'.

If you have not been on the school website lately, you may not have noticed that both the 2023 Annual School Board Report and the External School Review Report 2024 are now on the school website for your reading pleasure. I am happy to respond to any queries you may have about these two documents. Based on the findings of the external review and our own ongoing self-assessment, we are currently in the process of writing the Strategic Plan for 2025-2027.

Next Wednesday at 6pm there will be an update on the building and expansion works. The P&C has been advertising it through their channels but in case you missed it, all parents are welcome to attend. It will be here at school in the library.

Addressing Your Child's Anxious Avoidance

WHAT IS THE ADDRESSING YOUR CHILD'S ANXIOUS AVOIDANCE PARENTING PROGRAM?

Addressing Your Child's Anxious Avoidance is a group parenting program facilitated by the School Psychology Service aimed at helping parents/carers increase their child's ability to cope with anxiety and decrease anxious avoidance. During the program parents/carers will develop a clear plan to address their child's anxious behaviours, recruit and engage supporters, and explore how to communicate without promoting escalation.

WHAT DOES THE GROUP INVOLVE?

Addressing Your Child's Anxious Avoidance is a multi-week program with each session running for two hours. Each group will have approximately 15 participating families (one or both parents/carers) and is facilitated by two school psychologists. Activities are based on the Non-Violent Resistance evidence-based therapeutic approach. It includes whole and small group activities and take home tasks are set for between sessions. Children do not attend the sessions with parents/carers.

ARE THERE ANY RISKS FOR PARTICIPANTS?

It's possible that when participants start to use the strategies taught in the program, they or their child may initially experience a higher level of distress as anxious behaviours are addressed. However, as participants continue learning and practicing a wider range of strategies, these are likely to reduce.

HOW WILL INFORMATION BE KEPT AND SHARED?

Information shared within the group is confidential and is not shared outside of the group. Should facilitators become concerned about a child's safety or well-being external agencies will be notified. Where appropriate, the facilitators will endeavour to assist families to identify the appropriate next steps in gaining support.

At the beginning and end of the program participants will be asked to complete short questionnaires. This data is used to evaluate the effectiveness of the program and to get an understanding of how participants are travelling. File notes regarding parent/carer involvement in the program will be recorded, stored securely, and will be placed on an electronic student School Psychology file.

- The website can only be viewed using a web browser on your computer, mobile phone or tablet. An app is not available at this time.
- If you still need to register, you will need an access key and a Parent Portal registration link via email to link your existing account to your child's records. If you haven't received this, please contact the school's front office team for assistance.

Here is an insight to what we have been doing in our year 2 classrooms.



Sound

For our science unit we explored the elements of sound in our everyday lives. Being able to see, feel and express how we hear sound was a very engaging way of identifying sound in our lives. Students made music boxes where they could adjust the rubber bands, the size of the box and the strength of plucking the bands to hear different sounds and see different vibrations.



We then were able to listen to different sounds in everyday life such as: a car horn, waterfall, school bell and vibration, and drew what they thought the sound looked like in their minds. As you can see this turned into some beautiful artwork.







School Values

With the introduction of the new school values, year 2 has been exploring what it means to apply these in our everyday interactions.

To demonstrate collaboration the students participated in STEM activities which required higher order thinking, cooperation and communication to successfully complete the tasks in their groups. Each student held onto a string attached to a rubber band that they needed to manipulate to pick up and put down cups into a tower.
